

Levels of Care

ALL LEVELS OF CARE INCLUDE MEDICATION MANAGEMENT

Level 1 - Independent Living/Supervision: This level of care is for residents who are mostly independent and require minimal assistance with daily tasks. They may need some supervision for safety and security but can manage most activities on their own.

Level 2 - Supervision and Cueing: Residents at this level may need more supervision and reminders to complete daily tasks. They may require assistance with selecting clothing, reminders of meal times, bathing and other activities, but can still perform many tasks independently with reminders and cues.

Level 3 - ADL Assistance: This level of care involves assistance with activities of daily living (ADLs) such as bathing, dressing, grooming, and toileting. Residents may need help with mobility and other daily tasks.

Level 4 - ADL Assistance with Supported Transfers: Residents at this level require assistance with ADLs and may also need help with transfers, such as moving from a bed to a wheelchair. They may have mobility challenges that require frequent support and supervision to ensure safety and prevent falls.

Level 5 - Total Complete ADL Assistance and or Hospice: This level of care provides total assistance with all activities of daily living. Residents at this level require full support with bathing, dressing, grooming, toileting, transferring, and other tasks. Hospice care may also be provided for residents who require specialized end-of-life care.

Please note: Our levels of care are determined during an assessment with our Delegating Nurse. Risk of falling, Behavioral concerns and psychosocial diagnosis will increase your level of care. All residents receive an initial Level of care prior to admission and an additional assessment 30 days after admission. Your initial level can be increased or decreased after the 30 day assessment.
