

NEW VISITOR GUIDELINES

As of March 12, 2021

Please abide by the CDC guidelines and adhere to the core principles of Covid-19 infection prevention during your visit:

- Proper handwashing hygiene before and after visit
- Wear a properly fitted mask
- Social distance 6 feet apart

This applies to both vaccinated and non-vaccinated individuals.

- Please schedule visitation prior to arrival
- Visitors are no longer required to be tested or vaccinated (or show proof of such) as a condition of visitation

NEW VISITOR GUIDELINES cont.

As of March 12, 2021

Visitors are still encouraged to become vaccinated and as a precaution, Lorien will still offer on-site Point of Care (POC) testing for families and visitors when requested.

- Indoor visitation is allowed, however, CMS stresses that outdoor visitation remains preferred, even when the resident is fully vaccinated against Covid-19
- Visitors will continue to be screened for symptoms
- Visits with loved ones will occur in a private setting or a designated area
- Indoor visitation will be suspended if a new case of Covid-19 among residents or staff is identified
- Compassionate care visits will be allowed at all times unless the visitor displays symptoms


NEW VISITOR GUIDELINES cont.

As of March 12, 2021

Close contact with a resident:

- Resident must give consent
- Resident must be fully vaccinated
- Both the resident and visitor must wear a tight-fitting mask
- Both the resident and visitor must perform hand hygiene before and after the visit

Visitors who are unable to adhere to the core principles of COVID-19 infection prevention should not be permitted to visit or should be asked to leave. By following a person-centered approach and adhering to these core principles, visitation can occur safely based on this facility's policy and procedure



Visitation:

- Visitation can be conducted through different means based on a facility's building structure and the residents' needs
- Preferred method of visitation is outdoor visitation
- When outdoor visits cannot be accomplished due to environmental factors and/or resident condition, in facility visitation will be performed

Guidelines:

- All visits need to be scheduled with the building ahead of time
- All visits are limited to 20 minutes per visit to ensure that all residents are able to receive visitors
- All visitors will be screened for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 (temperature check, questions or observations about signs of symptoms, recent contact with COVID positive individual or Person Under Investigation (PUI) and denial of entry of those with signs or symptoms or close contact
- Hand hygiene is required prior to visit (use of alcohol-based hand rub is preferred)
- Visitors must wear a mask or face covering (completely over the mouth and nose)
- Social distancing will be maintained at least 6 feet between persons
- Visitation instructional signage will be posted throughout the buildings for guidance
- Visitation will be person centered and with an adequate degree of privacy



HANDWASHING 101

Follow these five steps every time.

1. Wet your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap.
2. Lather your hands by rubbing them together with the soap. Lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.
3. Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds. Need a timer? Hum the “Happy Birthday” song from beginning to end twice.
4. Rinse your hands well under clean, running water.
5. Dry your hands using a clean towel or air dry them.



How to use hand sanitizer:

1. Apply the gel product to the palm of one hand (read the label to learn the correct amount).
2. Rub your hands together.
3. Rub the gel over all the surfaces of your hands and fingers until your hands are dry. This should take around 20 seconds.
