- ➤ The Birthplace of the American Industrial Revolution: The American Industrial Revolution began in Rhode Island when Samuel Slater built his water-powered cotton mill in Pawtucket in 1790. This marked the beginning of the United States' transformation into an industrialized society.
- ➤ Home of the Oldest Tavern: The White Horse Tavern in Newport, established in 1673, is recognized as the oldest tavern in the United States. It offers a glimpse into 17th-century America and continues to operate as a restaurant today.
- ➤ A Haven for Religious Freedom: Founded by Roger Williams in 1636 as a haven for those seeking freedom of conscience, Rhode Island was the first colony to guarantee all its citizens freedom of worship. This principle was revolutionary at the time and laid the groundwork for the religious freedom clauses in the U.S. Constitution.
- ➤ Culinary Innovations: Rhode Island is known for some unique culinary creations, such as coffee milk (the state drink), clear clam chowder, and the infamous hot wiener. Additionally, the state is renowned for its seafood, particularly quahog clams, which are used in a variety of local dishes.
- ➤ Home of the First U.S. Open Golf Tournament: The first U.S. Open Championship in golf was held in Newport at the Newport Country Club in 1895. This event marked the beginning of what would become one of the four major championships in professional golf.


